John's train departed without him, but all his ski equipment and his money were still on board, and by chance asked a stranger for some help with a ticket. The stranger was Gabrielle's father.

Philanthropy - goodwill and kindness to a fellow human being - brought Gabrielle and John together and it has been a part of their lives ever since. The Goudys know the strength of our community is through the people who live and work here. After John's career in the Royal Navy, the couple settled into life on the Island and both graduated from the University of Victoria. Music always played a vital role in the lives of their families. All their celebrations included music. "Christmas is not Christmas without *Handel's Messiah*", says Gabrielle.


