Originally from Port Alberni, British Columbia, **Caiden Meyer** is a saxophonist and music educator committed to creating meaningful musical experiences for young learners. He earned a Bachelor of Music in Music Education from the University of Victoria in 2026, where he studied saxophone, and will begin a Bachelor of Education at the University of British Columbia in Fall 2026.

Caiden has taught students of all ages throughout the Greater Victoria area, providing instruction in saxophone, ukulele, and piano while leading instrumental clinics for school music programs. His teaching is grounded in the belief that every student deserves a supportive and engaging learning environment where curiosity, creativity, and confidence can flourish. With a particular passion for elementary music education, he strives to create positive

musical experiences that inspire students to continue making music throughout their lives.

During his time at the University of Victoria, Caiden served as President of the Student Music Educators Association, co-coordinated the university's annual Music Discoveries Weekend Camp, and performed with the University of Victoria Wind Symphony as Principal Saxophonist during the 2025-26 season. He also spent nearly three years teaching with Oak Bay Secondary School's Island Ukulele program, working with students in Grades 2 through 8 through instrumental and choral music.

As both an educator and performer, Caiden draws upon diverse experiences in classical, jazz, and rhythm and blues traditions. In addition to saxophone, he enjoys playing the flute, clarinet, ukulele, and bass, and values the perspective that comes from exploring music through a variety of instruments and styles. He believes music is a powerful way to build creativity, confidence, and community, and is passionate about helping students discover the joy of making music in a supportive and encouraging environment.
